Safeguarding Adults Policy

1. Purpose of the Policy

- **1.1** Tyne and Wear Fire and Rescue Authority (TWFRA) is committed to safeguarding the community in accordance with our vision of 'Creating the Safest Community'.
- **1.2** Living a life that is free from neglect and abuse is a fundamental right for every person. The Care Act 2014 ensures that the most vulnerable members of society are afforded appropriate support and protection.
- **1.3** This policy and the associated procedure establishes responsibilities and ensures that TWFRA promote good practice and work in a way that can prevent harm and abuse and ensure that allegations or suspicions of abuse are dealt with appropriately.

2. Policy Statement

- **2.1** TWFRA recognises that the need to safeguard adults in our community is everyone's responsibility.
- **2.2** TWFRA has a responsibility to take action in relation to adults at risk with consideration given to the six key principles:
 - Empowerment People being supported and encouraged to make their own decisions and informed consent.
 - Prevention it is better to take action before harm occurs.
 - Proportionality the least intrusive response appropriate to the risk presented.
 - Protection support and representation for those in greatest need.
 - Partnership local solutions through services working with their communities.
 - Accountability accountability and transparency in delivering safeguarding.
- **2.3** In addition, the Care Act 2014 imposes a duty on all public organisations to co-operate.
- **2.4** Adults at risk are defined as individuals aged over 18 who:
 - Have needs for care and support (whether or not the local authority is meeting any of those needs) and
 - Is experiencing, or at risk of, abuse or neglect and

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• As a result of those care and support needs is unable to protect themselves from either the risk of, or the experience of abuse or neglect.*1

3. Responsibility for this Policy

- **3.1** Authority for ensuring implementation and compliance with this policy rests with the Assistant Chief Officer, Community Safety (ACO, CS); the Area Manager, Community Safety (AM, CS) will ensure that this policy is complied with.
- **3.2** The AM, CS is also responsible for regularly reviewing this policy to ensure its currency and issuing updates.
