Stay Safe




Never play with matches or lighters.

Never play with FIRE





FIREFIGHTER FRED wants you to be safe. Can you decide what is safe to play with and what is dangerous? Write the words in the correct boxes.






Early Warning


FIREFIGHTER FRED says if you have a fire in your home, you need to know what to do. Can you fill in the boxes with words and pictures to make a fire plan for your family.



A firefighter's uniform




This firefighter works with **FRED**, her name is **FIREFIGHTER FREDA**. Label and colour her uniform.






